Access Routes FAQs (For Prospective Higher Education providers)

1. How do I go about getting my institution recognised as an Approved Provider?

 Application for recognition as an Approved Provider of the Royal Academy of Dance's (RAD) Access Routes offering can be made by letter addressed directly to the *Director of Education* of the Royal Academy of Dance.

Your application would need to include the following information:

- Details of the dance/dance teaching degree/s you offer, including:
 - o Programme Specification/s
 - o Module Outlines?

2. What are the benefits of my institution becoming an Approved Provider?

- The Access Route provides a unique opportunity for students to work towards eligibility for RAD Registered Teacher Status (RAD RTS), adding value to and enhancing their undergraduate studies.
- Access Route students receive free student membership to the RAD.
- The Access Route is delivered by highly qualified, experienced teachers.
- The Faculty of Education has over 20 years experience of delivering high quality blended learning programmes.
- The RAD has an international reputation for developing and upholding professional standards in dance teacher education and training
- The RAD professional qualifications are highly regarded by employers and professional bodies across the world, and provide an excellent gateway for career progression and employability.
- Students enrolled on the Access Route join a vibrant international learning and teaching community.
- After successful completion of the Access Route, if graduates choose to apply to RAD RTS they join an international network of professionals and gain a range of membership benefits.

3. What happens if our degree content changes?

- You would need to notify the *Director of Education* and include details of your revised programme/s changes to:
 - o modules offered;
 - o content of modules;
 - o name of programme
 - o validating university.
- Following review of your updated programme, the RAD would be in contact should any amendments be required to the content of the Access Route delivered for your institution.
- Any major amendments to the programme content and/or programme title would require a new Heads of Agreement to be drawn-up and signed.

4. What are RAD's expectations of an Approved Provider?

- Signed and dated Heads of Agreement, detailing the expectations of the provider and the Royal Academy of Dance.
- To work together with the Royal Academy of Dance to coordinate the promotion and delivery of the Access Route leading to RAD RTS.
- To provide the information necessary for the Royal Academy of Dance to:
 - Confirm students as registered on their programme of study;
 - Submit an Annual Statement, identifying those students who have successfully completed the relevant undergraduate degree;
 - Secure the consent of each student under applicable law, prior to submitting such information to the RAD;
 - Confirm eligibility for RAD RTS for those graduates who successfully complete the Access Route in addition to their Undergraduate degree.
- To acknowledge that fees will be charged by the RAD directly to each Access Route student.

5. How long does the Heads of Agreement run for?

 The Heads of Agreement are signed for a period of three years, following which a new agreement can be entered into if both parties agree.

6. How do I let students know about the Access Route?

- You can advertise the Access Route using all your normal marketing channels.
- The RAD can supply you with information regarding the Access Route.

7. Can I advertise my institute as an Approved Provider?

- Approved Providers can advertise that they are working in partnership with the RAD and use the RAD's logo on their website and marketing materials.
- Use of the RAD's logo must be in line with the RAD's branding quidelines.

8. What are the costs for becoming an Approved Provider?
